Scripture Reading: Exodus 27-28

Matthew 21:23-46

Praise the Lord! Luke 2:9-12 say, "An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." I am well aware that what the angel spoke here was referring to Jesus being born in Bethlehem about 2,000 years ago. He was telling them that there wasn't anything they should be afraid of because Jesus had come. That was surely good news.

All that was true for them and I want you to know that we can receive good news from this as well. Let me put it this way. Has Jesus come into your life? If the answer to that is, "Yes" then I have some good news for you. There isn't anything you need to be fearful about because Jesus has come. Isn't that good news?

Look at what Jesus spoke to us in John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Jesus has come into your life and that makes all the difference. He brings peace and we are told, Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. Deuteronomy 31:6 says, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you." Jesus has come and He is with you.

Scripture Reading: Exodus 29-30

Matthew 22:1-22

Praise the Lord! Let me show you some very interesting verses. Acts 16:6-7 say, "Paul and his companions traveled throughout the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been kept by the Holy Spirit from preaching the Word in the province of Asia. When they came to the border of Mysia, they tried to enter Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them to." Do you see what I meant when I said these were interesting Scriptures? Paul was traveling around and preaching the Gospel wherever he went. Paul wanted to go into Asia but he was kept by the Holy Sprit from preaching there. Doesn't that seem kind of interesting. Then Paul wanted to enter into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them to go there.

If these verses raise some questions in your thinking it is alright. Just know that God can answer our questions. Look at the next verses. Acts 16:7-10 say, "So they passed by Mysia and went down to Troas. During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." After Paul had seen the vision, we got ready at once to leave for Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them."

God had called them to preach the gospel there. This is what God wanted and this is where God wanted them to go. If they had gone to those other places they would not have been able to go where God wanted them to go. I am going to show you some more on this tomorrow, but for today know that Paul needed to find what God wanted him to do and then he needed to do that.

Prayer: Lord, I want to be led by the Holy Spirit all the time. If You, Holy Spirit, tell me not to do something or if You tell me not to go somewhere, I want know that You have something else for me to do. I don't ever want to miss out on what You want. I trust that You are always right. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Exodus 31-33

Matthew 22:23-46

Praise the Lord! Yesterday, we looked at some interesting verses where Paul was told "No" and then he was told "Yes". Take a look at 2 Corinthians 5:14 from the NIV version and then from the KJV version. NIV "For Christ's love *compels* us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died." Now look at this same verse in the KJV. "For the love of Christ *constrains* us; because we thus judge, that if one died for all, then were all dead."

One version says that the love of God *compels* us and the other version says the love of God *constrains* us. Would you like to know which one is right? They are both right. The Greek word that is used here can mean both things.

Now, before you get confused here, me me ask you a couple of questions. 1. Have there been times when the love of God *compelled* you and wanted you to do something? I am sure you have felt the love of God *compelling* you to do some good things. Here's my next question. 2. Have there been times when the love of God *constrained* and stopped you from doing something you wanted to do? I am sure you have felt the love of God *constraining* you from doing some bad things.

When we are going about our lives and doing things there are times when the Holy Spirit will say, "Yes, do that". And there will be times when the Holy Spirit will say, "No don't do that". We need to let the Holy Spirit guide us and direct us in all things. When we live like that we will be living like we should live. Look at what Jesus said in John 5:19, "Jesus gave them this answer: "Very truly I tell you, the Son can do nothing by Himself; He can do only what He sees His Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does."

Prayer: Lord, I want to be led in all things. I want to accept Your guidance when You say, "Yes" and I want to accept Your guidance when You say, "No". I want to live like You want all the time. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Exodus 34-36

Matthew 23:1-22

Praise the Lord! Ephesians 2:8-9 say, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God not by works, so that no one can boast." We are saved by grace and we should be thankful. No one is saved by works. That is true because no one could be good enough. We all need grace.

Romans 1:17 says, "For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."" This verse says we are saved by faith and it doesn't contradict Ephesians. God has grace for us and when we put our faith in Him then we are saved. If a person tries to be saved by works or by keeping the law they will fail. When we turn to God in faith we will find that He has grace for us that we would never earn.

Romans 3:22 says, "This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe." Romans 3:23-24 say, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by His grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus."

We were all sinners and totally lost with no hope of ever being good enough or by doing enough good things to be saved. "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." God sent Jesus to pay for our sins and open salvation for us. Thank God for His love and His grace.

Prayer: Lord, thank You so much for saving me. I know that I was totally lost without You and I know that I could never have been good enough to be saved on my own. Thank You for having grace for me and for revealing the gospel to me. I want to live fully for You and I ask You to bless my Church today. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Exodus 37-38

Matthew 23:23-39

Praise the Lord! Look at Philippians 4:6-7, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." One version puts the first part of these verses this way: "Don't worry about anything. Instead pray about everything." That is great advice. Actually, it is more than just great advice. It is God's Word for us. If you find yourself worrying about something and this verse comes to your mind, do what it says. Pray about what you are facing rather than worrying. I want to remind you that worrying doesn't help and praying does.

These verses also tell us that when we pray God will give us peace. I don't want to belabor what I have already said but I do want to say that worrying won't give you peace. Anyway, pray and God promises to give you a peace that *transcends all understanding*. When God gives you peace you may not be able to understand why you have it, but it is real. You need to embrace His peace. His peace will *guard your heart and your mind in Christ Jesus*.

Here is another verse about peace. John 14:27 says, "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Jesus said that He would give us peace and then He goes on and says He will give us *His peace*. Again, you may not understand that. You don't need to understand it. You need to believe it. Receive *His peace* and embrace *His peace*.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for speaking to me about praying more and worrying less. I know that Your Word is always right and I know that putting Your Word into practice, in my life, is always what I need to do. Help me to pray about everything and to know that You hear and that You answer my prayers. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Exodus 39-40

Matthew 24:1-22

Praise the Lord! Yesterday, I showed you some verses from Philippians 4 that talked to us about praying more and worrying less. I hope you put those truths into action in your life yesterday and I hope you do them today.

Going on in Philippians 4 look at verse 8, "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things."

What you think about is very important. Let me ask you a question in an interesting way to help you see my point. What mental movies are you playing in your head? Are they thoughts about defeat and despair OR are they thoughts of victory and favor?

If you are having a hard time with your thoughts let me share something with you. It takes a thought to overcome a thought. If you find yourself thinking on things that are not good and helping you, replace them with thoughts of good things. If you need help knowing what kinds of things you should be thinking on look at this list: Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.

Matthew 7:24, "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock." Thinking on good things is being a doer of the Word.

Prayer: Lord, I want to be a doer of Your Word and not a hearer only. Help me to be aware of the things I fill my mind with. If I am having a hard time, help me to replace wrong thinking with thoughts of good things. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Praise the Lord! Isn't it amazing that God had these things written down for us? Of course everyone has always needed these things, but we really need them and God has spoken to us because He loves us that much.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for loving me. I thank You that You loved me and saved me. I also thank You for consistently speaking to me about things I need to hear. Thank You for speaking to me from Your Word. I know that You have peace for me. I want to have peace and I want to share peace with others. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Praise the Lord! When I am writing about prayer or encouraging you to pray I often remind you that God hears your prayers and that He answers them. Look at Exodus 15:22-25, "Then Moses led Israel from the Red Sea and they went into the Desert of Shur. For three days they traveled in the desert without finding water. When they came to Marah, they could not drink its water because it was bitter. (That is why the place is called Marah.) So the people grumbled against Moses, saying, "What are we to drink?" Then Moses prayed to the Lord, and the Lord answered and showed him a piece of wood. He threw it into the water, and the water became fit to drink." Moses prayed and God answered.

2 Chronicles 33:13 says, "And when he prayed to Him, the Lord was moved by his entreaty and listened to his plea; so He brought him back to Jerusalem and to His kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the Lord is God." Manasseh prayed and God heard him and God answered him. God hears our prayers and He answers them.

Now, with that in mind look at what Jesus said in Matthew 6:9-10, "This, then, is how you should pray: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your Name, Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Jesus told us to pray for God's Kingdom to come and for His will to be done on earth just as it is in heaven. God hears your prayers and He answers them. Do you think we need God's Kingdom to come and do think we need His will to be done on earth just as it is in heaven? If you do, then pray and know that God hears your prayers and He answers them.

Prayer: Lord, I pray right now for Your Kingdom to come and for Your will to be done on earth just as it is in heaven. I know that You answer prayer and I have great confidence now because I am even praying just what You told me to pray. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Leviticus 18-19

Matthew 27:32-66

Praise the Lord! Yesterday, I reminded you that God hears your prayers and He answers them. I showed you some people who prayed and God answered them. Then I showed you something that Jesus told us to pray for and we did pray for that. When we pray in line with God's will we can have confidence that He will hear us and that He will answer our prayers. When we pray what Jesus tells us to pray we can certainly have confidence.

Here's some verses that make that same point. 1 John 5:13-15, "I write these things to you who believe in the Name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life. This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of Him." When we pray in accordance with His will, He hears us and He answers us.

With that in mind, here is something we know is God's will because Jesus, Himself, told us to pray for it. Matthew 9:36-38, "When Jesus saw the crowds, He had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field."" Now, I am sure you know that I am going to have us pray what Jesus told us to pray but I also want to encourage you to pray for these things often because we certainly need more workers. I also have more on this tomorrow.

Prayer: Lord, I ask You to send out more workers into Your harvest fields. You told me to pray for this so I know that I am praying in accordance with Your will. Help me to have faith that You hear my prayers and to know that You answer my prayers. I also ask You to me remind me to pray for this often. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

Praise the Lord! Ephesians 2:8-9 say, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast." We are saved by grace. That is such good news. I know some people struggle with this because it seems too good to be true. First of all, I want you to know that the message, we are saved by grace is in the Word and that settles it as truth. We may need to learn more about being saved by grace but it is still true.

Look a little further in this verse, For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith. We are saved by grace - through faith. When you heard the good news of the Gospel and turned you life over to Jesus you did it by faith, and God saved you. You didn't deserve it. It was by grace through faith.

This verse also tells us more. This is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast. We are saved by *grace* not by works. We were not good enough to be saved and we could never become good enough to be saved. We are saved by *grace*. It takes *faith* to believe that.

Jesus was good enough to save you. Jesus lived a perfect holy life. When He died on the cross He was made sin for us so we could become righteous in Him. 2 Corinthians 5:21 says, "God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God."

Prayer: Lord, thank You for saving me by grace through faith. I believe. I know that with Your help I can settle the truths of Your Word in my life. Please help me to keep growing in You. I am never going to quit living for You and I want to represent You well to others. Help me to be willing to share good news with everyone. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

He trusted in Jesus! Then when he died he was immediately with Jesus in paradise. Even in death he took refuge in Jesus. Here's some more on this. When this criminal put his faith in Jesus, Jesus forgave him and made him righteous. So this righteous man, *in Jesus*, found refuge in God.

Prayer: Lord, I want to honor You in all things including being kind to those in need. I also want to seek refuge in You no matter what I am facing. I know that You have saved me and I know that You have made me righteous in You. I know that I am going to spend all eternity with You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

I also want to encourage you to not neglect the other two things in this verse. Here are some words that might not have stood out to you: Always, continually and in all circumstances. God revealing His will to us is a good thing. Be thankful for what He as spoken to you today. I think we should pray.

Prayer: Lord, I know that every good thing in my life is a gift from You and I want to thank You more constantly for them. I also thank You for showing me Your will today. Help me to do what You have spoken to me: always, consistently and in all circumstances. I love You! In Jesus' Name, Amen.

It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit." I know you are expecting this, so rather than let you down: Say this, "That's for me!"

Those who trust in man will be let down and end up cursed. Those who trust in God will be blessed. These verses tell us to *trust* in God and to have our *confidence* in Him. The more we live for God and see Him working in and through our lives the more *confidence* we will have in Him. If you ever meet someone who seems to have deep seated *confidence* in God that person will probably be a person who has lived for God a long time. The more we trust in Him the more confidence we will have in Him.

Prayer: Lord, I don't want to trust in anyone or anything other than You. I trust You and I know that my confidence in You is growing the longer I trust You. This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "He took up our infirmities and bore our diseases."

These truths are real. We need to believe them and we need to renew our minds to them. The Word speak the truth. We need to believe and have faith for all Jesus has provided for us.

Praise the Lord! Look at Mark 7:8-9, "You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions." And He continued, "You have a fine way of setting aside the commands of God in order to observe your own traditions!" These people were letting go of the Word and holding on to human traditions. If and when traditions are contrary to the Word they are bad. Some people choose their traditions over the Word. We need to base our lives on the Word.

Look at what Jesus said to those who were choosing to obey their traditions over the Word in Mark 7:13, "Thus you nullify the Word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And you do many things like that." Don't miss this. They were nullifying the word of God. Here is a dictionary definition of what nullify means: To make of no use or value; cancel out.

These people were making the Word of God: Worthless, of no value and they were canceling it out. We base our whole lives on the Word. We don't ever want to *nullify* it in any way. To guard against doing that we need to stay in the Word and we need to be open to everything the Word says. This is why I give you the whole Bible in Scripture Readings each year. The more time we spend in the Word the more God can speak to us.

Look at Psalms 119:105, "Your Word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path." This is a picture of the Word showing us step by step how we should live. The Word can and will light our path. Always choose to believe what the Word says.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful for Your Word. I don't ever want to nullify Your Word. Thank You for consistently speaking to me from Your Word. I will lay aside anything and everything that doesn't line up with Your Word. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Mark 7:14-37

Praise the Lord! Look at John 1:29, "The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John the Baptist recognized Jesus as the Lamb of God. In the Old Testament the people sacrificed lambs for their sins. Every one of those lambs was a picture of Jesus coming and laying His life down for the sins of the world

Look at John 3:16-17, "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him." These verses are so important.

God loved the world even though all of mankind had sinned and fallen short of how God wanted them to be. God's love moved Him to send Jesus so we could be saved. Jesus willingly came to be the Lamb of God. He laid His life down on the cross as a sacrifice for our sins. John 3:16 says God loved the *world* so He sent Jesus to save the world through Him.

These verses also tell us that God didn't sent Jesus to condemn us but to save us. This is an important truth. If you have accepted Jesus as your Lord and Savior, you are born-again, your sins are forgiven and there is no condemnation for you. You are free from condemnation because Jesus has set you free from condemnation. Now let me make a very important point. If God has no condemnation for you then you should not condemn yourself. Jesus' sacrifice was great enough to set you free from all condemnation.

Prayer: Thank You, Jesus for dying on the cross for my sins. I know that Your death on the cross was sufficient to pay for all my sins and I know that You have set me free from all condemnation. Help me to know and believe that there is no condemnation for me because I am in You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

**Scripture Reading: Numbers 23-25** 

Mark 8:1-21

Praise the Lord! 1 Samuel 17:17-18 say, "Now Jesse said to his son David, "Take this ephah of roasted grain and these ten loaves of bread for your brothers and hurry to their camp. Take along these ten cheeses to the commander of their unit. See how your brothers are and bring back some assurance from them. They are with Saul and all the men of Israel in the Valley of Elah, fighting against the Philistines." God was working here.

David was being sent to deliver some food to his brothers at a time when the men of Israel were are war with the Philistines. They were at a stand still. Goliath was challenging the men of Israel to come and fight him. None of the men in God's army would accept his challenge.

So, God was positioning David to go and defeat Goliath. I am sure you probably know the story, but I want to point out that God was the One who positioned David for this great and glorious victory.

Look at first part of Zechariah 4:10, "Do not despise the day of humble beginnings." There was nothing glorious about taking food to his brothers, but David was obediently doing what was asked of him. That positioned David to defeat Goliath.

Luke 16:10 says, "He that is faithful in a small trust, will be faithful in a greater: and he that is unfaithful in a little, will be unfaithful in much." Here's my point for you on this last day of February. Be faithful in what you have to do and God will use you in more.

Prayer: Lord, help me to be faithful. Help me to be faithful in little things so I can be used in greater things. I trust You to position me wherever You want me to be and I trust You to use me in whatever ways You want. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
