Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 31-32 Titus 2

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 33-35

Titus 3

Praise the Lord! I am so blessed I have the privilege to share the Word of God with people like you. I am also able to continue verses when I don't finish them on the day I start them.

1 Peter 3:8, "Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble." There are two things that I didn't get to yesterday.

We should be *compassionate*. We need to have compassion for others when they are going through hard things. We need to feel compassion and we need to act upon it. Look at what James said in James 2:14-17, "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."

The last thing mentioned in 1 Peter 3:8 is our need to be *humble*. The opposite of humility is pride. We need to be humble. I know that you are blessed and you know that I believe in our being blessed. I write about being blessed often on here. Having said all that, we always want to be humble with someone that is going through hard things. Look at what James said about our being humble in James 4:10, "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will lift you up." When we are humble God will lift us up.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for Your blessings and I know that everything good in life is because of Your blessings. Help me to have compassion for others. I also want to be humble. Help me to know that You have blessed me so I can bless others. I am so thankful for all the good character traits that You are growing in my life. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 36-37 Philemon

Praise the Lord! 1 Peter 3:8 listed five things we should have in our lives and verse 9 tells us things that we shouldn't do and it tells us why. "Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing."

We shouldn't repay evil for evil. Look at Proverbs 20:22, "Do not say, "I will repay evil"; wait for the Lord, and He will deliver you." You may need to read that verse again. Don't fight and defend yourself. Let God do it. Believe me, God can do a better job. Trust Him. Romans 12:14 says, "Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them." We are not only to avoid striking back at people who persecute us, we are to bless them. (By the way, if this seems like it is really speaking to anyone reading this: That is because it is what God really wants to speak to you and it is for your good.)

Now, look at what the last part of 1 Peter 3:9 says, "Repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing." I don't want you to miss something here because it is really good. We should bless so that you may inherit a blessing. The law of sowing and reaping always works. If a person sows curses, what to you think they will reap? If a person has sows blessings, what do you think they will reap?

I feel like I need to add another Scripture is support of this truth because it is that important. Galatians 6:7 says, "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows."

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for the law of sowing and reaping. I thank You for every area in my life that I have consistently sown good things and I know that I am reaping good things. Please, oh please, help me to know if there are any areas where I am sowing bad things and help me to quit it. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 43-45 Hebrews 3

Praise the Lord! Let me show you some things about Abraham. Look at Romans 4:18, "Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him, "So shall your offspring be." God had promised Abraham that he was going to have a son and God was going to bless mankind through him. When God made this promise, Abraham was very old and he had never had any children. When God made the promise, the Word says that Abraham believed God.

Look at Galatians 3:6, "So also Abraham "believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness." And Look at Romans 4:3, "What does Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness." Don't miss this. God gave Abraham a promise. That was God's part. Abraham believed God. That was Abraham's part. Now please know that when God makes you a promise it is His part, your part is to believe.

Because Abraham believed God he received what God had promised him. Because he believed, he also lived for God. Look at what James said about believing and doing what God says in James 2:22-24, "You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called God's friend. You see that a person is considered righteous by what they do and not by faith alone." Believe the promises God has for you and put your believing into action.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful for all the promises You have given me. I believe and I want my life to line up with what I believe. I also thank You for making me righteous in Jesus. I want to live like a person who is righteous, in Jesus, should live. Thank You for never quitting on me. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 46-48 Hebrews 4

Praise the Lord! When God promised Abraham a son, Abraham believed God was going to keep His promise. I have to tell you that the promise really did happen but it didn't happen right away, but Abraham kept believing.

Look at Romans 4:19, "Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead—since he was about a hundred years old—and that Sarah's womb was also dead." Abraham kept getting older and older. In the natural the chance that he would have a son became more and more unlikely. BUT praise God, He was not limited by the natural. God is a supernatural God.

God keeps His promises. Look at Numbers 23:19, "God is not human, that He should lie, not a human being, that He should change His mind. Does He speak and then not act? Does He promise and not fulfill?" God keeps His promises. (Did you need that reminder?)

Now, for Abraham and Sarah the days and years passed. But Abraham did not weaken in his faith. Whenever any of God's people have promises from God they need to believe God and not weaken in their faith. When you have promises from God, don't weaken in your faith.

Here's a very helpful verse. 2 Corinthians 4:13 says, "It is written: "I believed; therefore I have spoken." Since we have that same spirit of faith, we also believe and therefore speak." Believe God's promises and speak what you believe.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that I have given my life to You. I know that You are never limited in Your power and ability to keep Your promises. I choose to believe what You have promised me and I am never going to quit. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

This is why "it was credited to him as righteousness." Through this whole process Abraham never quit believing. I am sure he was reminding himself over and over that God has power to do what He promised.

This is why "it was credited to him as righteousness. Abraham was righteous because he believed. Look at 2 Corinthians 5:21, "God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." When you believed in Jesus and gave Him your life, He saved you and He made you righteous *in Him!* Thank God!

We need to be like Abraham. We need to know the promises of God, we need to believe them and we need to never quit. Don't waver and don't quit. As he did those things he was *strengthened in his faith*.

He was fully persuaded that God had power to do what He had promised. That was having faith. Our faith has to be based on the Word and all of the times God has kept His promises should help us to continue in faith. Romans 10:17 says, "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the Word about Christ." The more we hear the Word and believe it the more our faith will be strong.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for saving me and I thank You for keeping me. Help me to live by faith. I don't ever want to waver and I certainly never want to quit trusting You and Your promises. Jesus had made promises to Abraham and He kept them. I want to make sure that you remember what Hebrews 13:8 says, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." Jesus made promises to Abraham and He kept them. Jesus has made promises to you and He is going to keep them too. Believe.

Look at what the Word says in Romans 4:23-24, "The words "it was credited to him" were written not for him alone, but also for us, to whom God will credit righteousness—for us who believe in Him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead." God is making sure we know that the promises of God are for us. We need to believe these promises.

We believe that God raised Jesus from the dead and we need to believe all the promises. I had someone ask me one time, "Will I ever get to the point where I don't have to live by faith?" I told him the answer to that question is, "No". Romans 1:16-17, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile. For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."

Prayer: Lord, thank You for giving me faith to be saved. Thank You for giving me faith to keep living for You. I know that I was completely lost without You and I know that, by faith, I am completely saved with You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Jesus died on the cross for our sins and He was *raised to life for our justification*. 2 Corinthians 5:21 says, "For our sake He made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." Jesus was made to be sin for us so we could be saved.

- 1 John 4:9-10 say, "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent His only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins." God loved mankind so much that He sent Jesus to die for our sins and so we could be saved. Jesus loves mankind so much that He willingly came and died on the cross so we could be saved.
- 1 Peter 3:18, "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive in the Spirit." Jesus suffered and died for your sins. He was righteous but He was made sin so you could be saved, but death could not hold Him. He was raised from the dead and He is alive forever. Jesus is alive and He is living in us. Thank God.

Prayer: Lord, thank You, Father for sending Jesus to die in the cross for my sins. Thank You, Jesus for coming and dying on the cross for my sins. Thank You Holy Spirit, for revealing all these wonderful things to me. I know that You have saved me and I know that I am going to be with You all forever. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Ezekiel 7-9
Hebrews 10:24-39

Praise the Lord! According to Proverbs 1:4, God gives us wisdom, for giving prudence to those who are simple, knowledge and discretion to the young." Thank God for the Word. It gives us wisdom. I am sure we all know that we need wisdom and when we get wisdom we will know that we need even more wisdom. We never have enough and God never runs out.

God's Word and wisdom also gives us prudence. I looked that up and it says, acting with or showing care and thought for the future. Have you ever made a decision that later you wished you hadn't made? You might have regretted it right away or a long time later. Either way prudence and being prudent would have helped you to take thought for the future and to avoided the problem. I think we can know that this all ties into being patient. Anyone need more patience? It comes with more wisdom.

This verse also talks about God's wisdom helping those who are *simple* and those who are *young.* We should all want all of the help God has for us as His people. Philippians 4:19 says, "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of His glory in Christ Jesus." All means all. If you need wisdom, God has it for you you. If you need patience, God has it for you. If you need provision or healing, God has those things for you too. I could go on and on but I am pretty sure you get my point. Knowing and remembering the truth that God will meet ALL your needs is a part of what wisdom produces in your life.

Proverbs 1:5 says, "Let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance." Let the wise listen keep listening.

Praise the Lord! Proverbs 1:6 says that wisdom is, "for understanding proverbs and parables, the sayings and riddles of the wise." God wants you to have understanding.

Look at Mark 12:28-33 and notice what is said about understanding in verse 33, "One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked Him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" "The most important one," answered Jesus, "Is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." "Well said, teacher," the man replied. "You are right in saying that God is one and there is no other but Him. To love Him with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."

First of all, notice that this man came to Jesus with his questions. That was a good decision and Jesus told him what he needed to know. He accepted the wisdom that Jesus had given him. Take your questions to Jesus. He wants you to have wisdom and He will help you.

In verse 33, this man listed several things but among them he said we need to love Jesus with all our understanding. So, ask for understanding, let Jesus give it to you and then love Him with all your understanding.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for all the wisdom and understanding You have given me and please give me more. I want understanding for myself and so I can help others. I am determined to use all that You have given me to live more fully for You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

I am going to go to some New Testament tomorrow, but I want to remind you that when a person knows what the Word says it is always good and they also need to do what it says.

James 1:22 says, "Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." Go for wisdom. James 1:25 says, "But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do."

I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. These believers had given their lives to Jesus, just like we have, and Paul wanted them to live their lives worthy of their calling. Paul said they had been called. Did you know that you have been called too. Ephesians 1:11 says, "In Him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of Him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of His will." God had chosen them and He has chosen you too

Ephesians 1:18 says, "I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in His holy people. Jesus has called you too.

Prayer: Lord, I am amazed that You chose me and I am so thankful that You did. Help me to know how to live my life worthy of Your calling. I know that no matter what I go through I have hope and I know that I have an inheritance in You. I don't ever want to miss out on anything You have for me. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Praise the Lord! Ephesians 4:1-2 say, "As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love."

If Paul told us to be *humble and gentle, patient, bearing with one another in love* it would be great advice, but that is not all that Paul said. He told us to **Be completely** *humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love*.

Now that we have noticed that Paul wants us to be completely doing these things. Look at Hebrews 7:25, "Therefore He is able to save completely those who come to God through Him, because He always lives to intercede for them." Jesus is able to save us completely. Here's my point. Jesus saved us completely and now we need to live completely like He wants.

If this feels overwhelming to you, I have some good news for you. When Hebrews 7:25 talked about Jesus saving us *completely* it also tells us that we can come to Him, and live for Him, **because He always lives to intercede for us.**

Jesus chose you. He laid His life down on the cross so you could be saved. He has given you a new life in Him. He has made you a new creation. He has given you His Word to learn His ways. AND He is interceding for you. Hebrews 7:25 says He has saved you completely and He always lives to intercede for you. Praise God for all He has done for us and for all He is still doing for us.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for revealing to me how I should live and thank You for praying for me. Help me to be completely humble, gentle, patient, and bearing with one another in love. Holy Spirit, I know You are always with me. Speak to me if am ever settling for less than how You want me to live. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

This is a wonderful truth that we need to settle in our thinking and we often need to be reminded. Look at what Jesus said in John 10:10, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." The devil is always trying to steal, kill and destroy but THANK GOD Jesus is always giving us life and life to the full. Thank God that we have given our lives to Jesus.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that You are my Lord and Savior. I am thankful for all that You have for me. I see that both the Old Testament and the New Testament confirms this truth. I believe. There are a lot of things I could comment on in these verses but you probably notice that I underlined the word <u>one</u>. <u>One</u> is mentioned seven times. The verses we talked about yesterday talked about how we need to be in unity. As I thought about this, I think these references to <u>one</u> are illustrating the unity that God has for us. God doesn't have a lot of ways to work in our life. He has <u>one</u> plan and <u>one</u> way.

Check this verse out. John 14:6 says, "Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."" Jesus is the one way, He is the one truth and He is the one life. No one comes to the Father except through Jesus.

I preached on this verse and I said that Jesus was either a liar, a lunatic or He is Lord. Let me explain. If Jesus knew that He was not the only Way and He said He was, He would have been a liar. If Jesus wasn't the only Way and He thought He was then He would have been a lunatic. The truth is this: Jesus is the only Way! He knew that was the truth and He was not wrong when He said it. He is the only Way! You may hear some people say, "There are many ways to heaven" but they are wrong. They may say, "It doesn't matter what you believe as long as you believe in something." They are wrong. Jesus is the only Way.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that I know Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. I am so thankful that I have given my life to You and I know that it was the best decision I ever made. Help me to show others the way to You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

1 Corinthians 12:4-6 say, "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work." God has gifts for you. Use them. Your gifts are needed. God is working through you.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for Your grace. I know that I am saved by grace and I know that You have given me gifts by grace. Help me to know and accept the gifts You have given me and help me use them more. I believe that You have given me the gifts You want me to have and I believe they are needed. God wants us to grow up. So He gave the five-fold ministry to the Church to help us to grow.

So Christ Himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip His people for works of service. First of all notice that Christ Himself gave these gifts. Matthew 7:11 says, "If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask Him!" God only has good gifts for us.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for Your ongoing work in our lives. I really do want to grow up into all that You want me to be. I want to be mature and I want to be more like You. Help me to know that You only have good gifts for us. Thank You for apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Well, look at what verse 13 says they were given, "Until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." Apostles help God's people to be in the unity of the faith and so God's people can have faith and become mature attain to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. We still need to be growing, we still need to become more mature and we still need to become more like Jesus. So, we still need apostles. Apostles are gifts from God and they are good gifts. Apostles are leaders in the Church and we still need leadership.

Prophets are mentioned next. Prophets speak for God. The Apostles and Prophets often work together. The Word speaks of them laying foundations. That was certainly needed in the early church and it is still needed today. I will write some more about them tomorrow, but remember God only has good gifts for His people.

Prayer: Lord, I know that You only have good gifts for Your people. I thank You for the gifts of apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers. Praise the Lord! Ephesians 4:11 says, "So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers..."

I started writing to you about prophets yesterday. Here are some Scriptures about prophets from the book of Acts. Acts 11:27-30 say, "During this time some prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them, named Agabus, stood up and through the Spirit predicted that a severe famine would spread over the entire Roman world. (This happened during the reign of Claudius.) The disciples, as each one was able, decided to provide help for the brothers and sisters living in Judea. This they did, sending their gift to the elders by Barnabas and Saul." God warned the people of a famine that was coming and He spoke to the church through a prophet. The people believed and they took action. They helped God's people. These are good things. God only gives good gifts.

Acts 13:1-3, "Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off." In this case, there were prophets and teachers there. God wanted some people to be set apart to spread the Gospel. They heard from God and they did what God wanted them to do. Like I said before, they believed and they took action in line with what God said. These were all good things. God only gives good gifts.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for the good gifts You have given the church to help us to grow and to become mature. I always want to be listening to what You are saying and I want to be open to hear from the ministry gifts You have placed in the church. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Leaving the next day, we reached Caesarea and stayed at the house of Philip the evangelist, one of the Seven. He had four unmarried daughters who prophesied." Paul was an Apostle and as he traveled he stayed at the house of Philip who was an evangelist. Thank God for His gifts to the Church.

Now look at 2 Timothy 4:3-5, "For the time will come when people will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear. They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry." Paul told Timothy to keep doing the work of an evangelist. Paul said that times were getting worse and worse (does that sound like today) and Paul told him to keep preaching the Gospel and getting people saved. They needed evangelists back then and we still need them today. Amen?

Prayer: Lord, thank You for the gift of Evangelists. I sure know we need them. Please help us all to share the Gospel with those who are lost. I may not be called to the office of evangelist but I know that You want all of Your people to share the Gospel. I thank You for giving me boldness. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Ezekiel 40

1 Peter 5

Praise the Lord! Here's an example of Philip, an evangelist, in action. Acts 8:26-38, "Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (which means "queen of the Ethiopians"). This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship, and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet. The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it." Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked. "How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. This is the passage of Scripture the eunuch was reading: "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before its shearer is silent, so He did not open His mouth. In His humiliation He was deprived of justice. Who can speak of His descendants? For His life was taken from the earth." The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?" And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When evangelists encounter people who are not saved they know what to do and they do it. Thank God. We all need to be sharing the Gospel more.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful for the Gospel. Thank You for everyone who shared the Gospel with me. I know that You gift and use evangelists in special ways and I bless them. I also know that You want me to share my testimony with people who don't know You. Help me to have boldness and courage to speak to those You bring into my life like others have shared with me.
